A huge 'Thankyou' to all the parents for attending and we would like to extend a warm welcome to you in joining the family of PMGHS.




YEAR 7'S PLAY 'A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM'

YEAR IO CYBER SECURITY EVENT

The computer science pupils were invited to take part in a cyber event run by Lancaster University School of Mathematics. The event was held at Cardinal Newman College and was open to the computer science pupils from across the county and provided a valuable opportunity to use computing skills to solve a problem. The event followed the same format as an 'escape room', with the pupils being 'locked' into a crisis centre.

This computer science trip was an incredible experience. The event consisted of us working together in our teams against the clock, to solve a series of cryptic clues to prevent a cyber-attack being launched on the nation's infrastructure. It became very frustrating when we did not find all the clues straight away, but it taught us to be resilient and to persevere. The resources we were given were a Caesar cipher decoding wheel, a periodic table of elements, a suspect profile, a clue that we pieced together, a USB and a laptop. We had to log into the laptop using the resources, and find the password for the USB, to allow us to access some secret files. My favourite part of the escape room was when we got into





the USB, and found some pictures of the suspect's family, and found an audio file. It was slowed and the pitch was very low. Our group speeded up the audio file and changed the speed which made it easier to understand. We eventually completed our tasks, finding the password to enter the briefcase containing the computer virus. Our Computer Science class was split into two groups whilst doing all these tasks.


