- Recently invested in 'Borrower Synchronisation' feature for the library system so it updates any user details and login information every night by connecting with SIMS. This has ironed out any logging in problems for pupils and there has been a noticeable increase in pupils logging into the library website at home and reserving books etc.
- Suggestions box in the library is used regularly and l take the pupils interests on board when ordering new books.
- Different departments also email me recommended reading for their subjects, so I ensure I have copies of those in the library too.
- Dedicated space in the library for HiLo, EAL, Easy Reads etc. This has been helpful in supporting the new reading interventions that we have put in place.
- We have a subscription with the Clear Vision Project who lend us braille resources for visually impaired students.

CAREER TALK



We invited local professionals into school to talk to the Year 7's and 11's about their unique career journey as part of the Careers Enrichment and PSHE lesson. This was a valuable opportunity for the pupils to hear first-hand what different careers are like. The guest speakers talked about what qualifications they studied and what inspired them to choose their career path. Pupils also had the opportunity for a Q&A session. The goal of Career Talks is to equip pupils with the inspiration and information, and to make better informed decisions about their future career paths.





YEAR II MOCK INTERVIEWS

Our Year 11 pupils have been developing their interview techniques by engaging in Mock Interviews this term as part of the Careers Enrichment. Local employers volunteered their precious time to provide the Year 11's the opportunity to develop self-confidence and improve interview techniques. Each pupil was given essential feedback from our professional volunteers, which will help them make progress for the future. The event was a great success with interviewers praising the effort and commitment from the pupils. Feedback from our volunteers was extremely positive. Although some students were feeling the pre interview nerves they all left feeling proud of what they had accomplished and improved confidence ready for future interviews!

Year 7 and 8 pupils were treated to an educational and entertaining BAE Roadshow. Selective Year 8 pupils attended the CyberFirst Schools Northwest Empower event. The event is designed to transform the way that young girls think about careers in computing and challenge the underrepresentation of women in tech careers. This event took place at Blackburn Rovers FC, Elwood Park. The scheme is fully funded by the National Cyber Security Centre (NCSC). Pupils took part on the day in a range of activities which will help provide them with better learning and career opportunities in cyber and tech. There were various interactive and engaging activities and representatives from businesses, apprenticeship schemes and universities. Keynote speeches were led by inspiring women in STEM. All pupils were presented with a certificate in recognition of taking part in the CyberFirst event. The goal of these Empower events is to reach young girls at a pivotal moment in their education, to change their perspectives on computing and to inspire the next generation of cyber professionals.

Mobile Phone Policy

A gentle reminder to explain the school's policy on mobile phones and what is and isn't allowed. We all recognise the many ways that mobile phones can make our lives more convenient. However, they have no place in school. School is a place where young people need to focus on their learning, their personal development, and the development of their faith. Mobile phones are a distraction from these goals and that is why they are banned in school. Furthermore, in school, mobile phones represent a risk to safeguarding as images that are captured, without permission, can be shared and posted on sites beyond the knowledge or control of the school. This is unacceptable.

For these reasons I take the issue of mobile phones in school very seriously and there will be consequences for pupils who breach this policy. Please discuss the seriousness of this with your daughter and make sure that she understands the reasons for this stance and that she complies with the policy which can be found on our school website.

Please note

As the weather has become colder, several pupils sensibly choose to wear outdoor coats to and from school. May I remind you that our school uniform policy states that any coat must be either predominantly plain black or blue. Hoodies, fleeces, and scarves have never been part of our uniform and they are not permitted. We want all pupils to arrive and depart safely, therefore we ask parents not to park their cars on the main road outside the school which puts pupils and other car users at risk, instead please can you park somewhere safe away from the school.

Can I also remind you to ensure your daughter arrives to school on time, ready for the beginning of the day at 8.25am looking smart, alert, and eager to learn. Punctuality is such an important lesson for life beyond Preston Muslim Girls High School and we are determined that everyone arrives to school on time.

Medical/Dental Appointments

Please try and avoid arranging medical/ dental appointments during school hours. If necessary, please ensure your daughter attends school first and then leaves for the appointment. This will have minimum impact on her attendance. Evidence of appointment will be required when you come to pick up your daughter.

Polite notice

We would like to stress the importance of ensuring that all our pupils are fully equipped with resources, packed lunches, and PE kits before they come to school. This will minimise unnecessary contact in and out of school for parents and allow us to adhere to government guidelines in keeping all our pupils, staff, and parents safe.
