Technique		Definition	Example
1	Rule of three	Listing in groups of three things/ideas/word/phrase.	<i>Hunting is evil, cruel and outdated.</i> <i>Do it well, do it fast and do it now.</i>
2	Exaggeration	A statement/information that is untrue or over the top.	It is simply out of this world – stunning! This week, I had six tonnes of homework – it's too much!
3	Emotive language	Use words/phrases that arouse an emotion in the reader.	Eating meat is murder.
4	Statistic	Statistics: Factual data used to convince the reader.	85% of children believe homework should be abolished. 9/10 of people agreed that this would change their community for the better.
5	Rhetorical question	A question which is designed to make the reader think about the answer	<i>Isn't the solution obvious?</i> <i>Who doesn't want to succeed?</i>
6	Facts	Facts: something which can be proven to be true.	On average, a human will eat 7 spiders per year while sleeping. Preston Muslim Girls High School was graded 'Outstanding' by Ofsted
