

Please have a safe and restful summer.





CREATIVITY, DRAMA & COMPETITION



Genre Carousel Activities

Within the day, students explored different genres of Shakespeare's plays through a series of interactive workshops:

- **Macbeth (Tragedy):** Pupils became detectives in a thrilling murder mystery, deciphering clues to uncover the culprit in this dark and suspenseful play.
- **Romeo and Juliet (Love):** Armed with quills, students penned persuasive letters, immersing themselves in the tragic romance of Romeo and Juliet.

INTERNATIONAL WOMEN IN ENGINEERING DAY 2024

In honour of International Women in Engineering Day, Amey Group, a major national engineering company, hosted an annual Engineering Challenge. This year, 6 students from PMGHS were selected to represent our school in the Amey Challenge Cup.

The Challenge Cup event brings girls aged 13-15 into Amey workplaces to work with engineers for a day to solve a real-life engineering problem. It looks at all aspects of an engineering project including planning, budgeting and managing risk, and culminates with the teams presenting to a judging panel. Students worked in a team competing against representatives from other local schools. The competition combined mathematical, communication and teamwork skills, and offered students another way to express and develop their enjoyment of mathematics, as well as inspiring them to consider a future in the engineering pathway. Alhamdulillah, our Year 8 team, consisting of Fatimah Nomani, Afia Master and Hamnah Mamsa plus 3 pupils from another school, won the cup! Massive congratulations to them all!

SCOUTS


Our Year 8 Girl Scout Troop got together to plan a fun, interactive and engaging Scouts session for an often-overlooked part of our society: grannies!


TRANSITION DAY

CYBERFIRST MEGA FESTIVAL




National Cyber Security Centre
