


### MEET THE PUPIL




## BRITISH SCIENCE WEEK


### **STEM**

### ENRICHMENT

Year 8 students took part in a STEM activity where they were challenged with coming with an idea of using Technology to solve a real-world problem. Some of the ideas included a drone which could plant trees in remote parts of the world, an APP for homeless people to be able to find free food from local restaurants and supermarkets and a fish drone which could help clean up the rubbish from oceans around the world.

Students worked in teams, to plan, design and create a protype for their chosen idea. They then had to present their findings to Mr Mitchell and Mrs Kalang. 
