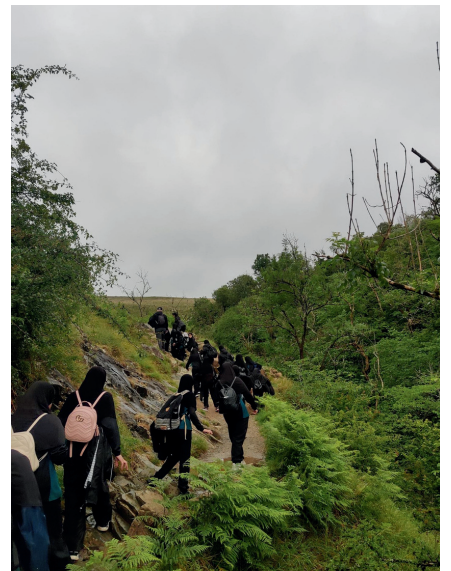
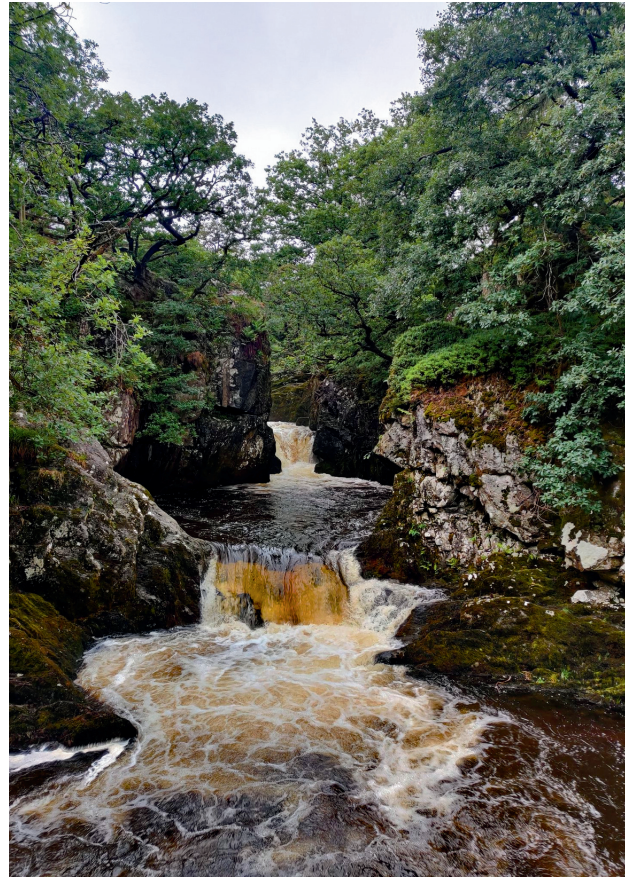
# INGLETON FALLS

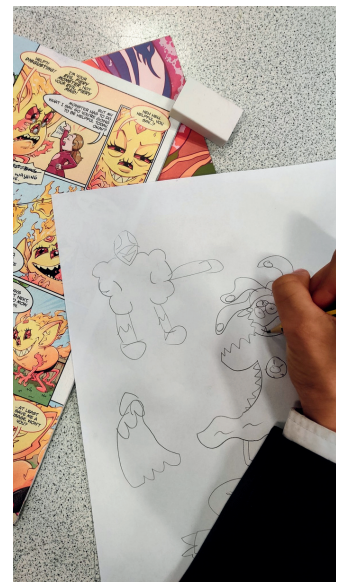
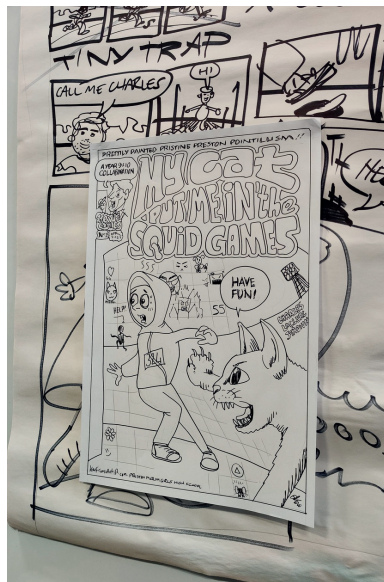
## A COMIC GENIUS VISITS!

# CHATSWORTH TRIP

## HISTORY

As one of the units for History GCSE, pupils study the 'Great Re-building', a period in which the nobility and gentry in England built some of the finest stately homes to showcase their wealth and status. These homes populate the British landscape but some, like Chatsworth were designed to impress even a monarch. Chatsworth House, the seat of the Duke of Devonshire, makes quite a statement and though little of its Elizabethan character remains, it portrays through its many features, the scale of the ambition of its successive owners. Set in the breathtaking landscape of the Peak District, the estate was first purchased by Bess of Hardwick and her second husband, Sir William Cavendish. Bess who started life as a member of the minor gentry, (modest landowners) rose into the ranks of the aristocracy through her many carefully arranged marriages.



Many have referred to her as something of a social climber, but she was more than this. Her shrewd business sense made her the equivalent of a modern-day business tycoon, and she went on to becoming the second richest lady in England after Queen Elizabeth I. Chatsworth House is where her journey started. The house has had a turbulent History and almost didn't survive the social changes and taxes of the early twentieth century. Chatsworth, like many other mansions, which needed armies of staff to run them almost fell into the hands of the national trust but was saved through some desperate maneuvering. The house is believed to have been the inspiration for Pemberley, in Jane Austen's, *Pride and Prejudice* and was indeed used as the setting for the most recent film adaptation of Austen's timeless novel. Aside from its fascinating History, it was also an experience that our pupils will take away and treasure. The annual History trip to Chatsworth House has become something of a tradition at PMGHS. We were blessed with glorious sunshine, yet again, which also seems to be becoming something of a tradition



# GEOGRAPHY FIELD TRIP

YEAR 10



As part of their GCSE Geography coursework, the Year 10 students embarked on a fieldwork trip to Garstang, a picturesque town nestled in Lancashire. Their mission was to investigate the characteristics of a local river by measuring its speed, depth, and width. Armed with tape measures, stopwatches, and metre sticks, the students spread out along different sections of the river. Some timed how long it took for a floating object to travel a set distance, calculating the river's velocity. Others waded in carefully to measure depth at intervals, while a few stretched tape measures across the banks to record the width.

Lots of comments about how the scenery was stunning—lush green fields, clear skies, and the gentle sound of flowing water. A few students misjudged the riverbed and ended up with soggy socks and wet feet.

The hands-on experience brought classroom theory to life, and many students said it was the highlight of their term. Not only did they gather valuable data for their exam, but they also enjoyed a refreshing day outdoors, learning in the heart of nature.

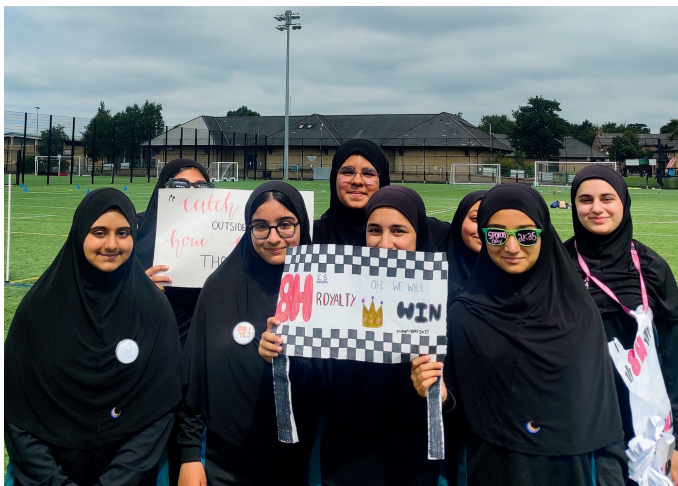
# SPORTS DAY

The day was filled with engaging and enriching sessions designed to give the girls a taste of life at secondary school.

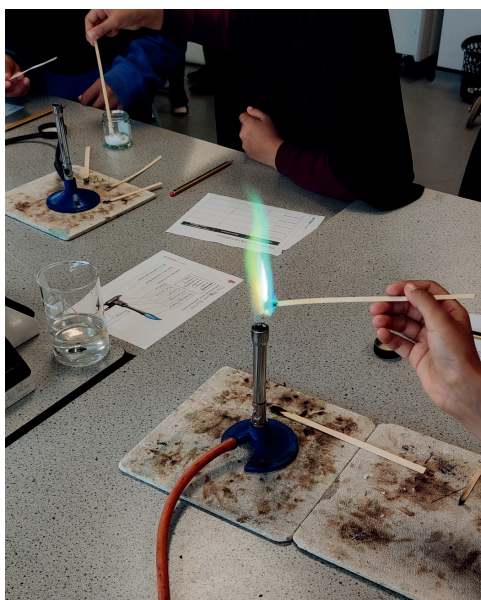
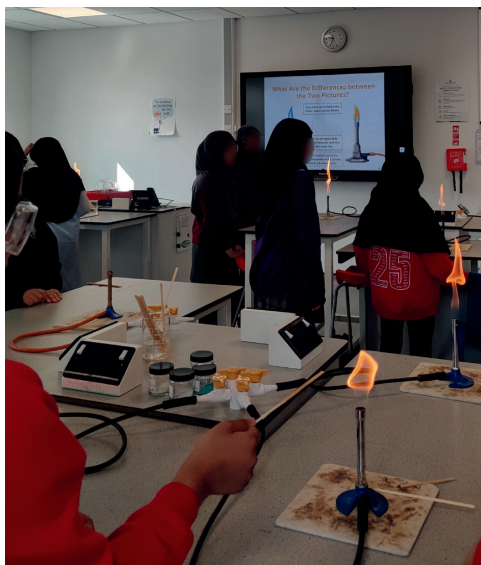
